Just as Christians have done for 2,000 years, let us turn our hearts and minds toward Bethlehem. Bethlehem was not a large or important city. Kings and Queens did not have their palaces in Bethlehem. It was a quiet, sleepy town.

The little town sits in the Judean hill country some ten miles south of Jerusalem. In the center of the town is an inn. The inn is filled with tired people looking for a place to rest.

They are Joseph and Mary from the Galilean town of Nazareth. They have had to travel for days to come to this city – the city of their ancestor, King David. They have come, like so many others, because the Roman Emperor has decided to count his subjects in order to tax them.

They arrive at the inn, but unfortunately, it is already full for the night. With nowhere else to go, they find shelter in a nearby stable. There, among the animals, Mary gives birth to the Christ Child. They name him Jesus.

They have no crib to lay him in and so a feeding trough – a manger – will have to make do.


HYMN "Away in a Manger" (remain seated)


